Legislative Updates

My Lifesaving Breast Cancer Screening Bill is Now Law

I am incredibly proud that my breast cancer screening legislation has been signed into law, marking a major advancement in early detection and access to cancer care across Pennsylvania.

The issue is deeply personal. My wife Kristen has shown remarkable strength throughout her two-year breast cancer journey, inspiring my commitment to both awareness and action.

Building on **Act 1 of 2023**, this new law ensures that follow-up diagnostic mammograms, breast MRIs and ultrasounds are covered without cost-sharing under state-regulated insurance plans. **Senate Bill 88**, now **Act 52 of 2025**, helps more Pennsylvanians access lifesaving care when it matters the most. I was honored to be recognized as the Legislative Champion of 2025 by the American Cancer Society Cancer Action Network for this work, and I remain committed to advancing early detection efforts in additional cancers.



Protecting Our Delivery Drivers

Inspired by a constituent and UPS driver who experienced an on-the-job incident, I introduced legislation to better protect our delivery drivers. **Senate Bill 919** would strengthen penalties for assaults against these workers while they are performing their duties. Delivery drivers often work alone, while playing a vital role in our communities, and they deserve to be safe on the job.

The proposal is part of my broader crime prevention package — a series of bills I am working on to ensure our law enforcement and prosecutors have the resources they need to keep our communities safe. Two of those bills, criminalizing porch pirating and enhancing penalties on street racing were signed into law. Our focus will be to pass the remaining bills in the crime package; increase penalties for gun store robberies, increase penalties on rioters and rioting organizers, expand DNA samples in the criminal justice system, enforce mandatory jail time for felons found to be illegally in possession of a firearm and reduce catalytic converter robberies.

Supporting Seniors

I continue to be a champion for affordable prescription medications for seniors through the PACE and PACENET programs. **House Bill 923**, now **Act No. 49 of 2025**, which mirrors the bill I authored in the Senate, extends the practice of excluding Social Security cost-of-living adjustments when determining eligibility for the PACE and PACENET programs.

Without this extension, more than 10,000 PACENET enrollees would lose their coverage, and over 12,500 PACE participants would face higher costs.

While serving in the House, I led the effort on expanding access to senior prescription assistance, raising the income eligibility limits for PACE and PACENET for the first time since the programs began, allowing an additional 32,000 low-income seniors access to the program, earning recognition from the Pennsylvania Pharmacists Association.



Supporting Our First Responders



Reps. Marcell and Hogan and I were proud to present state funding to Northampton Township Fire Department for tactical equipment and training for their firefighters and EMS. We were able to secure more than **\$700,000 in state funding** for all volunteer fire and EMS companies across the 6th Senatorial District. This investment helps ease the burden on local taxpayers while strengthening the vital services our communities rely on.

Supporting Our Next Generation of First Responders

I was thrilled to secure the state funding and partner with Bucks County Community College, Bucks County Emergency Health Services and several high schools to launch a fire and emergency services co-op program for local high school seniors. The program kicked off in the fall and gives students real-world skills, preparing them for critical roles in public safety, while providing college credits and professional certifications. I know firsthand the difficulty our local volunteer fire departments have with recruitment and retention of new members. I am proud to be able to help this new co-op program recruit the next generation of volunteers to help protect our community and look forward to supporting its growth and success.



Honoring A Fallen Hero



In November, the Worthington Mill Bridge was dedicated in honor of Colonel Daniel L. "Larry" Rubini, who devoted his life to service, both in uniform and in our community. Rep. Marcell and I were honored to support the legislation to have this bridge named in his memory, making this a lasting tribute to his dedication, integrity, and love of our country, connecting the community he served so well.

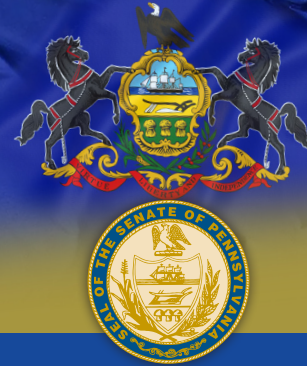
Grow PA Scholarship Grants

The first year of the Grow PA program to help connect young people to quality careers in Pennsylvania has been a tremendous success, according to statistics from PHEAA.

The Grow PA Scholarship Grant Program offers grants of up to \$5,000 per year for in-state students who agree to attend college in Pennsylvania, pursue a degree in an in-demand occupation and work in that occupation in Pennsylvania after graduation.

The top programs of study in the first year of Grow PA included registered nursing, early childhood education, business administration and management, biological sciences and accounting. Applications for this school year are now open.

Constituent Services

My staff and I are here to serve you. We can assist with senior SEPTA pass applications, assistance with PennDOT paperwork, property/tax rent rebate applications, unclaimed property, birth and death certificate applications and much more.

Money Match Program

Money Match, run by Pennsylvania Treasurer Stacy Garrity, is a new way for the Pennsylvania Treasury Department to return unclaimed property to its rightful owners. It's a law that the General Assembly supported unanimously, where Treasury will automatically return unclaimed property valued up to **\$500** to a single owner without requiring a claim form.

With the latest checks mailed, the program has returned more than \$50 million in its first year.

I recently introduced legislation to increase the current limit of **\$500 to \$10,000** to allow more Pennsylvanians to have the opportunity to get their property and money back. Treasurer Garrity has come to Bucks County several times to assist our constituents in finding money that is rightfully theirs. We were able to help our constituents find more than \$300,000 that they didn't know they had. Visit www.patreasury.gov for more info on this program or to find out if you have unclaimed property.
