Dear Mr. Oliver;

We are writing this letter to urge you to reconsider your two regulatory rate review requests to the Pennsylvania Utility Commission to increase rates for electric and natural gas services. While we understand the need to improve electrical and natural gas infrastructures, we believe raising rates will have a negative impact on our constituents who are already burdened with high costs.

In 2019, Governor Wolf unilaterally joined the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative (RGGI). While the intention of that program is noteworthy, the financial impact was staggering. We have spent the last 6 years fighting the decision from the previous administration to opt into a program that would have increased utility costs of \$1.4 billion annually. This was only settled in this past November's budget, which included the opting out of the program as advocated by us and other PA legislative Republicans. Energy costs are a prime driver of inflation, maintaining steady costs should be a priority.

It is not lost upon us that PECO received a rate increase of 10% for electric and 12.5% for natural gas in January 2025. Since those rate increases were implemented, PECO's net




revenue increased 47.7% over the previous year to \$814 million in 2025. The very next day after report earnings were announced, stock prices increased 5.5%. Proposing a 12.5% increase for residential electric customers and 11.4% increase for residential natural gas customers at a cost of \$429 million after a record year in today's economy is not the answer.

We are hoping you will meet with us to discuss your proposal and potentially your reconsidering of the PUC submission. We know that this is currently before the PUC, which will take time to investigate and ultimately will look to ensure that consumers are protected from excessive rate increases, but we look forward to discussing your proposal in person in the near future.




