Dear Senator Farry and Representative Hogan:

Thank you for your continued interest in the project. This letter is in response to your recent correspondence regarding the potential retention of the service roads as part of the U.S. 1, Section RC3 transportation improvement project.

With the connections between U.S. 1 and the service roads being discontinued, we determined that the majority of the service roads could be removed. The select removal of the service roads was proposed in response to concerns (e.g. recurring maintenance costs, and speeding) that we had previously heard during preliminary design.

In consideration of the comments that we received during the public comment period for the Environmental Assessment, the department recently completed additional analysis related to potential retention of the existing service roads (with no direct connections to U.S 1). The results of the analysis indicate that the service roads can generally be retained but will require some minor modifications to the proposed design. This modification would be consistent with the project's purpose and needs.

Please be advised that on June 1st, the project team will be meeting with representatives of Middletown Township to discuss the retention of the service roads along with additional comments provided by the township. As you may know, the municipalities currently own and maintain the service roads in their current configuration (including the adjacent traffic separator islands).

Should the township agree to retain the existing service roads (within their municipal limits), the department will schedule and meet with Langhorne Manor Borough to discuss the retention of the existing service roads that lie within their municipal

boundary. This meeting is anticipated to be scheduled within a few weeks after the Middletown Township meeting.
